

DESCRIPTION

As one of the nation's busiest Fire and Rescue Departments, Jacksonville has a growing need of Fire Stations to support its local communities. The newly developed eTown was one of those communities in need of emergency support. Fire Station 74's location was key to expediting service to Jacksonville's fast-growing Southside which includes eTown, part of Nocatee, and the southern Philips Highway area.

The station's design is contextual to the architecture prevalent throughout the eTown community. Its 9,500 SF design includes three bays for emergency vehicles, a locker room, bunk room, kitchen/dining space, a vibrant "fire engine red" entry feature that doubles as signage, and a striated, split-face block exterior that accentuates the day room and provides a dynamic accent to its contemporary design.
